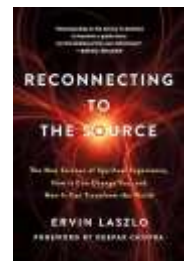


**A new adult Sunday School class will be offered starting on May 12th, at 9:10 am in Rm 206.** The class will be at least 6 weeks

#### 2024 Budget Update April 22, 2024

Vestry approved a 2024 total expense budget of \$1,048,584. Latest projected revenues (including pledges and estimated Spring Fling proceeds) are \$968,694, resulting in a current deficit of **(\$79,890)**.

**The current budget only funds the second priest position and paid secretarial staff through June and combines the Youth and Christian Education positions into one position at mid-year.**

**Retaining staffing at current levels through the entire year will increase our deficit by the following amounts unless additional funding is received:**

from Kingwood Park High School.

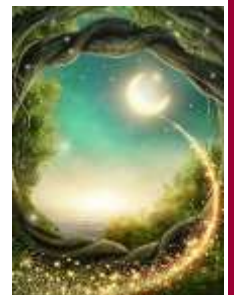
