2024 Budget Update April 22, 2024

Vestry approved a 2024 total expense budget of \$1,048,584. Latest projected revenues (including pledges and estimated Spring Fling proceeds) are \$968,694, resulting in a current deficit of (\$79,890).

The current budget only funds the second priest position and paid secretarial staff through June and combines the Youth and Christian Education positions into one position at mid-year.

Retaining staffing at current levels through the entire year will increase our deficit by the following amounts unless additional funding is received:

Second Priest \$42,181 Total Deficit (\$122,071) Secretarial \$12,410 Total Deficit (\$134,481)

Vestry Highlights April 2024

1. Closing the Budget Gap:

We have made significant progress in addressing our budget deficit this month. The Vestry has reallocated funds within the youth program budget, ensuring that the upcoming mission trip and EYC are fully funded with a surplus to spare. Our Spring Fling event was a success, and we received several generous donations that have contributed approximately \$30,000 to our finances. These efforts have reduced our deficit to under \$100,000. A big thanks to everyone for working towards a balanced budget.



2. Addressing Deferred Maintenance:


The Property Commission has started addressing deferred maintenance issues, beginning with the storage closet in the Great Hall. We understand that a broader scope of work is needed in this regard, so we have enlisted a Diocesan resource to evaluate our physical plant and identify critical areas that need attention. Their forthcoming cost estimates will guide our planning process, allowing us to tackle maintenance proactively and prevent escalating costs due to prolonged deferral.

3. Reinvigorating Fellowship and Inreach:

Our Spring Fling event was a huge success and has sparked renewed enthusiasm for fellowship within our community. We are planning next year's event and exploring ways to rejuvenate our Fall Festival. These events rely on the dedication of passionate volunteers who help to create vibrant community gatherings.
